## SIDE LETTER OF AGREEMENT

The City of Ottawa and the PBLC Unit 18, for the remaining effect of their current collective bargaining agreement which spans from May 1<sup>st</sup> of 2022 to April 30<sup>th</sup> of 2025, agree to the following Side Letter:

The City of Ottawa would like to increase the residency requirement. To that end, the parties agree to the following:

## **SECTION 18.7 RESIDENCY**

All employees shall reside within forty (40) miles of the City limits of the City of Ottawa within fifteen (15) months of hire date or upon completion of his/her probationary period which ever time period is longer.
