INFORMATION REGARDING SIDEWALK AND CURB REPLACEMENT

- 1.) The property owner shall obtain estimates and submit the application. When application is approved, applicant will receive an authorization for contractor to proceed with work. When work has been completed according to City specifications and has been inspected and approved by the Code Official, the City shall pay its share of the costs to the owner, based on the estimate approved on the application, and upon the receipt of paid bill from contractor. Payments will be made at the end of the month.
- 2.) The cost of “change of grade” or retaining walls for private property support will not be shared by the City.
- 3.) All work shall be done with City specifications. It is recommended that a Class X mix (4000 psi, air entrained) be used, but a (5½) bag mix (4000 psi) will be acceptable. (5½ bags of cement per cubic yard of concrete.)
- 4.) A sidewalk permit and grade shall be obtained from the City prior to construction and all work shall be inspected by the Code Official prior to pouring concrete.
- 5.) The width of sidewalks which will be shared by the City will be as they presently exist, but in residential areas not exceeding 5 feet of width nor less than 4 feet.
- 6.) The minimum amount of walk which will be constructed or reconstructed at one location is 25 square feet.
- 7.) New subdivisions are not included in this program.
- 8.) Replacement of driveway approaches or sidewalks on private property will not be included in this program.
- 9.) The thickness of sidewalks across driveways shall be increased to 7” and steel mesh or fiber mesh reinforced concrete installed at the owner’s expense.
- 10.) All sidewalks shall be so constructed as to have an incline toward the gutter of the street of less than 2%. The whole work of grading and laying down sidewalks, whether done by the city or by the owners of the respective lots or parcels of land abutting upon the same, shall be done under the supervision and subject to the approval of the commissioner of the department of streets and public improvements.
- 11.) Barricades must be provided by the property owners or contractor.
- 12.) Costs will be shared for sidewalk replacement or a new sidewalk on the following basis:
 - Residential Areas:**
 - a) If sidewalk work is contracted, the City can pay up to \$2.50 per square foot for residential areas to a registered contractor meeting public act 96-0437. Property owners shall pay the balance. Receipts must be submitted from contractor and concrete supplier for reimbursement.
 - b) If sidewalk work is constructed by owner, the City will pay for the cost of the concrete. Receipt from concrete supplier must be submitted for reimbursement.
 - Commercial Areas:**
 - a) If sidewalk work is contracted, the City can pay up to \$3.00 per square foot in commercial areas to a registered contractor meeting public act 96-0437. Property owners shall pay the balance. Receipts must be submitted from contractor and concrete supplier for reimbursement.
 - b) If sidewalk work is constructed by owner, the City will pay for the cost of the concrete. Receipt from concrete supplier must be submitted for reimbursement.
- 13.) Curbs shall be 7 inches wide and a minimum depth of 12 inches. Where patching is to be done, the limits of the patch shall be sawed.
- 14.) Costs will be shared for curb replacement on the following basis:
 - The City shall pay up to \$15.00 per lineal foot for complete removal and replacement and \$4.00 per lineal foot for partial patching. The balance shall be paid by property owners.
- 15.) ADA ramps are required where practicable.
